NH HEALTHY AGING DATA REPORT

New Hampshire became the third state in the country, joining Massachusetts and Rhode Island, to have its own Healthy Aging Data Report. This online tool, funded by the Tufts Health Plan Foundation and created by University of Massachusetts Boston, Department of Gerontology, provides information on healthy aging across 150 indicators for every city and town in NH. Energized by the availability of the report and the depth of information it



provides, alumni led the dissemination of the report at the community level. 25 alumni from around the state, have been trained as Healthy Aging Data Report ambassadors. These individuals received training on how to use the report including: reading and interpreting the data, methodology and sources of the data, and how to engage in conversations with opinion leaders and policy makers in communities.
