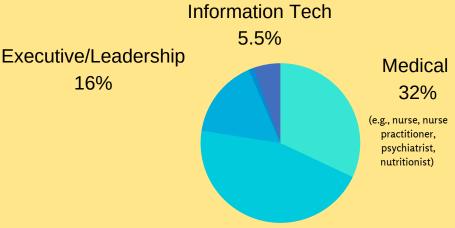

TOP 3 TELEPRACTICE MODALITIES



(e.g., community health worker,

occupational therapist, speech therapist, counselor)

- Interactive Video (46%)
- Mobile Devices to Share Info (19%)
- Telephonic/Audio (18%)

Only 5% of participants identified use of remote monitoring devices

Participants identified Zoom, Doxy.me, and VSee as the top platforms for engaging in video conferencing appointments. Other platforms identified include: Vidyo, Secure Video, One Doc, Star Leaf, Elation,

CONCLUSIONS & RECOMMENDATIONS

- There is widespread need for provider training.
 Develop networks to help professionals understand and implement best practices.
- Experience is predominantly limited to video conferencing.
- Promote use of other modalities, such as remote patient monitoring.
 Funding is a major barrier to access.
 Pursue collaborative funding streams to sustainably stand up telepractice.
- Concerns about compliance are prevalent.
 Monitor all activity with compliance officers, throughout and beyond the period of COVID-19.
