

Master of Science Degree in Recreation Management and Policy Graduate Assistantships Application

Applications are currently being accepted for a two-year Master of Science degree in Recreation Management and Policy (RMP MS). The RMP MS program offers four unique options to students: 1) <u>RMP MS in Recreation Administration</u>, 2) <u>RMP MS in Therapeutic Recreation Administration</u>, 3) <u>RMP MS in Adaptive Sport</u>. and 4) <u>RMP and Social Work Dual Degree (MS/MSW)</u>. The RMP MS Program prepares students for specialized or advanced careers in public, non-profit, private and commercial, agencies and organizations that provide recreation and tourism opportunities around the world. Most graduates of the program will enter professional practice; however, some will advance to doctoral programs.

A limited number of highly competitive full-time and half-time **Graduate Assistantship positions** are also available for qualified students. Full-time Graduate Assistantship positions include a tuition/fee waiver, an annual graduate stipend valued at approximately \$21,000, other additional benefits, and require 20 hours of work per week throughout the academic year as either a research or teaching assistant. Half-time Graduate Assistantship positions include a half tuition/fee waiver, an annual graduate stipend valued at approximately \$10,000, other additional benefits, and require 10 hours of work per week throughout the academic year as either a research or teaching assistant. The Graduate Assistant position starts in August.

The RMP MS Graduate Assistantship application process has 4 steps:

- 2. Applicants must apply for admission online to the RMP MS program through the UNH Graduate School online portal.
- 3. Applicants must directly contact via email the RMP MS faculty member with whom they wish to work and set up a Zoom or phone interview (see below for RMP MS faculty bios and information).
- 4. Applicants must complete the RMP MS Graduate Assistantship Application and email it directly to Dr. Michael Ferguson (Michael.Ferguson@unh.edu) no later than December 1.

Preference will be given to candidates with experience in therapeutic recreation, adaptive sport, outdoor recreation management, natural resource management, outdoor education, and/or social science research and project management. Any applicants applying for funding must complete all 4 steps and submit all requisite materials no later than December 1, 2023.
