Application to Transfer into Sport Management & Leadership Major

Policy

The Sport Management and Leadership major accepts and reviews internal transfer applications once per year. There are multiple parts to the application process and it is the student's responsibility to complete all aspects of the application. The checklist below may be used to assist students in organizing their required application materials. It also serves as an application cover sheet. Deadline for applications is May 1, 2024 4:00 pm. Note: Applications will be accepted once per year starting 2024/25 academic year. All admission decisions on internal transfer applications for the Sport Management & Leadership major (SML) will be made by the SML faculty. Space in the major is limited by available faculty and staff resources. Applications are reviewed between semesters after the registrar's office posts final semester grades. The faculty will consider overall GPA, grades in prerequisite courses, performance in SML courses, activities, and resume. Only completed applications will be considered final.

PLEASE ALSO NOTE: The SML Program has limited spaces available for majors. We are fast approaching a point when we will not be able to accept everyone who wishes to be in the major. The <u>Minimum Criteria for</u> <u>Application</u>:

1. Minimum UNH G.P.A. of 2.5

Student should provide the following: Completed Application (including student number), an **unofficial transcript**, Resume, Personal Statement (see below). All material should be forwarded in one (1) pdf to <u>Gretchen.Browne@unh.edu</u> by the deadline indicated above. - 6. SML majors are required to have a minor, cognate, or double major that supports their academic and career goals. How do you plan to fulfill this requirement and how will it benefit your future?

- I understand that I may not register for SML 761 until I have completed one full semester as a SML Major. Please note: SML 761 is currently offered in fall semester only.
- I understand that only 500 and 600 level courses will count toward major requirements prior to being admitted in to SML. As such, any 700 level class taken prior to admission <u>will not</u> count towards major requirements.
- I further understand that problems in course availability and my schedule may delay my anticipated date of graduation.
