One role she especially enjoys as program coordinator is providing a variety of training opportunities around assistive technology for all ages. She is especially fond of the work she is doing to help support and train seniors and service providers.



Stacy has spent the past year and half working with the Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) ServiceLink program in NH to implement a device demonstration and loan program as part of NH's No Wrong Door System. Through this program, each ServiceLink office has been provided with a variety of devices and training regarding the use of each device in order to provide device demonstrations and device loans to their clients. Through her membership in the Aging Research Affinity Group, Stacy is assisting with the research study, *Social and Health Service Utilization Among Low-Income Elders in Subsidized Senior Housing.* She hopes to be able to identify individuals' knowledge and use of assistive technology, eventually determining a means to get assistive technology into the hands of those seniors who need it. In the future, Stacy anticipates pursuing a Ph.D. program combining her love of teaching with her desire to serve and assist our aging population.
